

## **1.0.5 CLOVIS-HERNDON SHOPPING CENTER DRAFT REVISED EIR**

The Draft Revised EIR was circulated for a 45-day public review period pursuant to CEQA Guideline §15105(a). The 45-day public review period was from January 2, 2009 to February 16, 2009. The notice of availability was published in the Fresno Bee, which is a newspaper of local circulation. A notice of availability of the Draft Revised EIR was also mailed to property owners within 600 feet of the project site.

The Draft Revised EIR is an informational document focusing on two environmental issues as directed by the Court, intended to disclose the environmental consequences in these two areas (cumulative water supply and urban decay) of approving and implementing the Clovis-Herndon Shopping Center project. All written comments received during the 45-day public review period are addressed in the Final Revised EIR.

## **1.0.6 SUMMARY OF TEXT CHANGES**

## **1.0.7 RESPONSES**

Responses to comments received on the DREIR during the public review period are presented in Chapter 32, Comments and Responses. Each comment letter received is numbered at the top and bracketed to indicate how the letter has been divided into individual comments. Each comment is designated a number with the letter number appearing first, followed by the comment number. For example, the first comment in Letter 1 would have the following format: 1-1. The bracketed letter precedes responses to the letter's comments in Chapter 32 of this Final Revised EIR.

The comments received to the Revised DEIR by the City of Clovis have been carefully reviewed. As required by CEQA Guidelines section 15088, all comments received from public agencies, individuals, and organizations were evaluated based on environmental issues raised. The information provided in the responses to comments provides clarifications and additional information necessary for the decision makers and the public to understand the environmental consequences of the proposed project and for the decision makers to act on the project. As required by CEQA Guidelines section 15204, the responses to comments focus on significant environmental issues raised by the comments. All responses to comments contain a good faith reasoned effort at full disclosure regarding the disposition of these significant environmental issues.
